



## **Second Viatorian Joins Administrative Team at Saint Viator High School**

Saint Viator High School President Fr. Robert M. Egan, CSV, announced that another member from the Clerics of Saint Viator would be joining him on the administrative team. Beginning July 1, Fr. Corey Brost, CSV, will serve as Vice President for Mission Effectiveness, in order to ensure that all aspects of the school's curricular and co-curricular activities support and enhance the Viatorian mission. "I am pleased to welcome Corey to the administrative team and I look forward to working with him in the years to come," Fr. Egan said.

In the new role, Fr. Brost will help Fr. Egan with curriculum development and faculty evaluation, as well as collaborating on such things as institutional advancement, public relations, overseeing the athletic program, financial and budgetary matters, campus ministry activities and participating in board of trustee meetings.

Fr. Brost currently serves as chairman of the religion department, something he will continue, along with teaching one upperclassman course, World Religions.

"Saint Viator High School makes a difference." Fr. Brost stated. "Young people leave as highly educated, well-rounded people of faith with the ability to make the world more compassionate and just."

Fr. Brost brings a background in journalism and law to the post. He earned both his undergraduate and law degrees at the University of Illinois in Champaign before joining the Viatorians.

At school and among his Viatorian colleagues, Brost has worked to heighten public awareness of the needs of the marginalized and he has advocated for social justice reform.

Before his teaching career, Fr. Brost served as a lawyer at Association House for young people living in poverty, and as a caseworker for REST Shelter for the homeless. At Saint Viator High School, he serves as moderator for the STAND Club, or Students Taking Action Now for Darfur. Fr. Brost presides at school liturgies where he enjoys relating the gospel messages to the everyday lives of teens. He has authored a series of books entitled, "Gospel Connections for Teens."

On alternating Sundays, he is a guest presider at St. Edna Church in Arlington Heights, the Sheil Center at Northwestern University in Evanston, and St. Viator Church in Chicago.
